



Wells Gray Provincial Park, Hells Gate and Kamloops Heritage Train Aug 9-11th, 2012 - 3 Days

This is a great tour to get out of town and relax, take in some incredible BC scenery and attractions. Travel the Fraser Canyon and descend to Hell's Gate. Experience Wells Gray Provincial Park, a vast wilderness of pristine forests, high mountains, roaring rivers, big lakes and amazing water falls. Lunch with the cowboys of yesteryear and ride aboard the Kamloops Heritage Railway. It's all here for you to join in and have some fun this summer.



Day 1: August 9 - to Kamloops (L)

- Door to door pick up
- Admire the Japanese Gardens and the chainsaw carvings in Hope, the chainsaw capital of Canada.
- Follow the mighty Fraser River as you travel up the Fraser Canyon to Hell's Gate.
- Enjoy your aerial tram ride descending across the canyon and down to the river level to your first group lunch at the lower terminal. Discover the other exhibits and attractions such as the fisheries exhibit or get some great scenic shots from the Suspension Bridge.
- Enjoy the summer evening at the newly renovated Plaza Heritage Hotel downtown Kamloops.
- Take in the "Music in the Park" tonight at the Rotary Bandshell Riverside Park just a few minutes walk from your Hotel.

Day 2: August 10 - Kamloops (B/L)

- Today is your adventure to discover Wells Gray Park.
- Your journey to the Park is on the Yellowhead Hwy #5 following the Thompson River.
- Enjoy a stop at the Park visitor center for picture of the moose.
- Marvel at the spectacular water falls, wildlife and serene vistas.
- Wrangle up your appetite for a special bar-b-que group lunch at the Wells Gray Guest Ranch, a western, down home friendly atmosphere.
- Take in the world famous Helmcken Falls, a water fall three times the height of Niagara.
- Relax for another evening in downtown Kamloops and another evening of Music at the Rotary Bandshell in Riverside Park.

Day 3: August 11 - Kamloops to Home (B)

- There is rich history in the trains in Kamloops dating back to the arrival of the first train in 1885. All aboard for a ride on the "Spirit of Kamloops" pulled by a restored 1912 steam locomotive. Prepare to cross the South Thompson River on the 1927 Steel Trestle Bridge and travel under the shadows of Mt. Peter and Mt. Paul. Learn the story of the great train robbery of 1906 by Bill Miner.
- Travel home via Coquihalla Highway, passing the most scenic landscapes in the province.
- Door to door home return.
